

DOUBLE CHEVRON

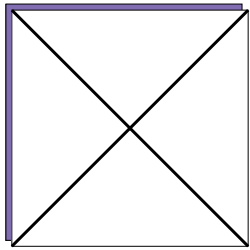
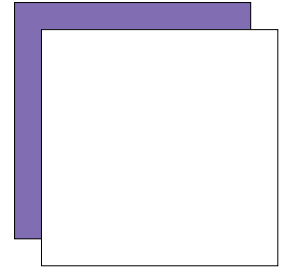
This 7 by 14 inch (finished size) Double Chevron quilt block is made from eight triangle squares. Use this 8-at-once method or your favorite way to make half-square triangle units.



Cut Fabrics

Cut one 8 3/4-inch square from each fabric.

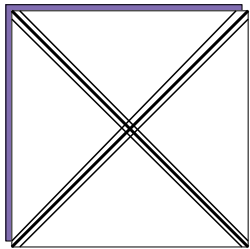
NOTE: You can cut larger and trim the triangle squares units later, if you prefer.



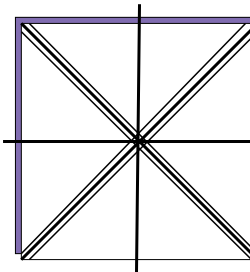
Sewing the Block

1. Stack the squares, right sides together.
2. Draw two lines diagonally across the square from corner to corner.
3. Stitch on each side of the drawn lines, 1/4-inch away.

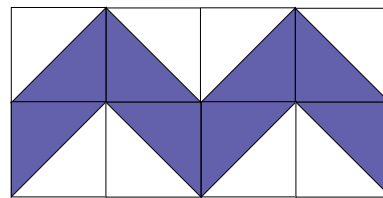
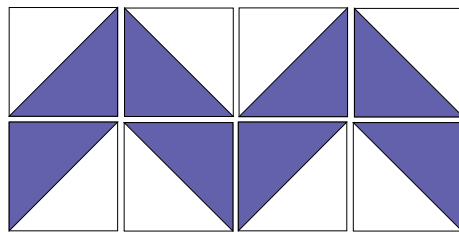
NOTE: You can draw the sewing lines in or stitch using a 1/4 inch foot.



4. Cut the large square vertically and horizontally into quarters and along the drawn diagonal lines to form 8 half-square triangles units.
5. Press the triangles squares, pressing the seam allowance toward the dark side. Each HST unit should measure 4-inches square. Square up and trim units if necessary.
6. Arrange the pressed units as shown below.



7. Sew the 8 units together to form the Double Chevron block



Block Lotto Guidelines

- Combine White solids or WOW prints with Chocolate Brown, Purple or Light-to-Medium Grays—fabrics may be solids, TOT or multi-color prints that are predominately Gray, Brown or Purple.
- You can enter a **maximum of SIX blocks**.
- You may use the same white in all blocks, the second fabric must be unique in each block.
- Use the Tag **chevron** for your blog posts.
