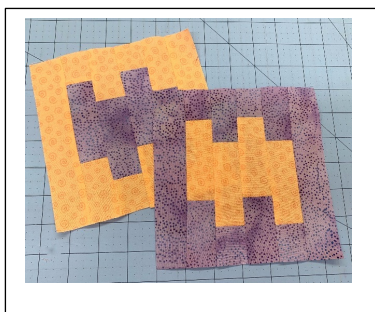
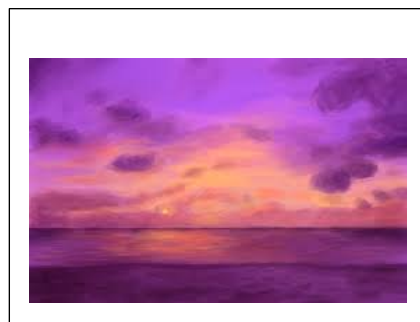


BLOCK LOTTO, November 2019 EVENING SUNSET BLOCK

Our block this month is an easy one that I'm hoping you'll enjoy. It was inspired by evening sunsets (think purples, oranges, peachy-pinks, etc.) and a block I saw on Pinterest. You need nothing wider than 1.5" scraps.



Our block contains two colors, referred to as the Background color and the Center color. Fabrics may be solid, batik, tone-on-tone or small prints. There should be good contrast between the two colors selected.

Colors: Any combination of the following:

PURPLES: Blue-purples to red purples; they may be pastels or saturated or anything in between, but please don't wander into actual maroon or blue.

ORANGES: Red-orange to orange-yellow; bright, pastel, peachy, apricot,

whatever. Just don't wander too close to red or yellow. 😊

PEACHY-PINKS are good, too (but not blue-pinks).

Cutting:

Background (may be the darker or the lighter color):

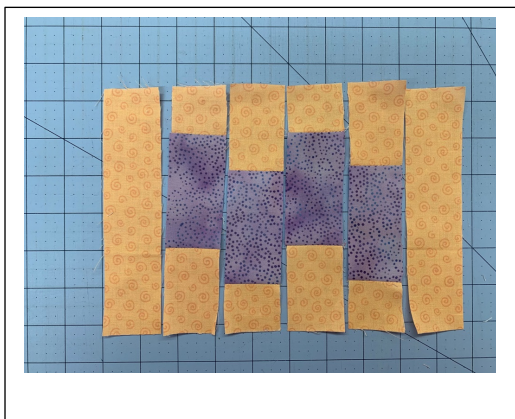
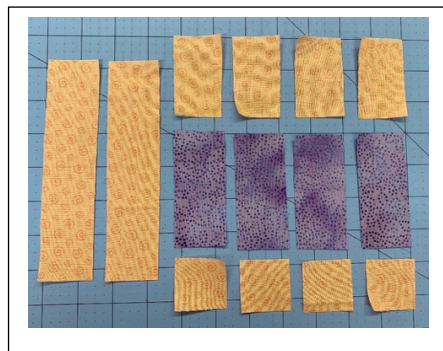
(2) rectangles, 1.5 x 6.5"

(4) squares, 1.5x1.5"

(4) rectangles, 1.5 x 2.5"

Center (may be the darker or lighter color):

(4) rectangles, 1.5 x 3.5"



Assembly:

1. Sew a 1.5" background square to one end of each of the four center rectangles.
2. Sew a 1.5x2.5" rectangle to the opposite end of each of the four pieces in previous step.
3. Press seams toward the darker color.
4. Lay out strips as shown in picture, left. Sew strips together, trim and press.

For the Lotto: Make up to 9 blocks. You may use the same fabrics in pairs if you reverse the color placement. Otherwise, vary your fabrics. Tag your post "Evening Sunset". These are so easy and use those narrow scraps. Have fun!!
